What is Project ECHO?



Using a template, patient details are e-mailed to the host prior to the scheduled meeting



Hosted by the Liverpool Hospital Hepatology team (Specialist, nurse, social worker, pharmacist) de-identified patients are discussed



Host generates letters confirming the plan for each patient. Patients get optimal care with the team they are most comfortable with. You!

- Tuesday **14th November**: Focus on Hepatitis C (HCV) 2-3 pm

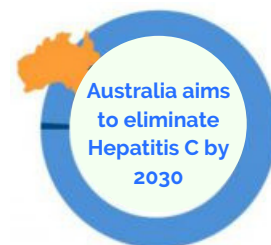
While we will "focus" on a different topic at each meeting (provide an update), you are welcome to present any of your liver patients at this meeting, particularly viral hepatitis.
